# **HIGHLIGHTS OF** INDIA-NEPAL PARTNERSHIP

Marking a watershed in the bilateral relations between India and Nepal, Hon'ble President of India Shri Pranab Mukherjee paid a State visit to Nepal from 2-4 November, 2016. This was the first visit of an Indian head of State to Nepal since 1998. President Mukherjee was warmly received by Rt. Hon'ble President Smt. Bidya Devi Bhandari on his arrival in Kathmandu. During the visit, Hon'ble President met with senior political dignitaries from the entire cross-section of the political leadership of the country as well as members of the civil society. President Mukherjee was accorded civic receptions at Kathmandu & Janakpur. At Pokhara, he addressed thousands of Gorkha Ex-servicemen congratulating them on their contributions to India's defence and security and towards strengthening bilateral ties. He was conferred with an honorary degree of D. Litt. by Kathmandu University. The President and Prime Minister of Nepal hosted banquets in Shri Mukherjee's honour. Throughout his stay in Nepal, Hon'ble President was received enthusiastically with immense warmth and affection, characteristic of India-Nepal relations.

## US \$ 1 billion committed by India for post-earthquake reconstruction of Nepal.

Committed to cooperation in Power Sector, India is now supplying 350 MW of electricity to Nepal. This is expected to increase to 450-470 MW in the next one month. Capacity will increase to 1000 MW within next two years once construction of Cross-Border Transmission Lines is Completed.


